

## Daylight Savings Time Change

The US government has changed daylight savings time starting in 2007. The Canadian government has also applied the same change in Canada. This change affects all users of TRC as of Sunday, March 11, 2007 at 2:00am.

To avoid any issues with this time change, your administrator will have to manually set the time on your THEOS server prior to opening Sunday morning (prior to your following business day if your store is closed Sunday).

### THEOS Corona:

To set the system time under THEOS Corona, log onto your **SYSTEM** account and run the command **SETUP TIME**. You will see a screen similar to the following:

You may set the time directly in the Time: fields. Alternatively if your system is connected to the internet, you can set the Sync To: field to [utcnist.colorado.edu](http://utcnist.colorado.edu) and your system will automatically update its time according to the UTC clock at the University of Colorado every few minutes, making your system time extremely accurate. You should also ensure that your Time Zone is correctly selected. You may use your mouse to navigate fields if you are on the main console or on a TWS PC. If you do not have a mouse available, you can use the Tab key to move between the fields.

### THEOS Version 4.2 and Earlier:

Under version 4.2, there is no interface for setting the time. To set the time under version 4.2 and earlier, log onto your SYSTEM account and run the following command:

**SET TIME hh:mm**

Replacing hh:mm with the appropriate time. There is no option to synchronize your clock to a UTC server under version 4.2, so you will need to set your clock manually.

### Windows:

Microsoft Windows will also be subject to this change. Windows XP with Service Pack 2 and Windows Server 2003 have updates available through the Windows Update system. Windows Vista contains support for the new DST rules out of the box. For other versions of Windows, you will be required to set the time manually.
